



NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending on the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2-3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

**Method:** Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy and let stand overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm x 20cm (8inx 8in). Bake in a slow oven for approx. 3 ½ to 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.






